Chasing Horizons - Travel Blog by Jill Fletcher

I just returned from previewing the Danube Explorer River Cruise and I am so excited to take Horizons Club members back in April! River cruising is a fun way to travel. A full ship holds only 180 passengers.

After arrival in Budapest, Hungary, boarding the ship, and having dinner, the ship's captain took us on a short nighttime cruise to see Budapest by night. Gorgeous buildings and bridges were all lit up!

Our first full day was spent in Budapest. A coach tour was provided for us to see the sights of this capital city. The afternoon was on our own. We visited a city market with local goods, fresh produce, meats, and lots of paprika and other spices.

River cruising is very popular on the Danube. In Budapest, there were 14 cruise ships lined up two or three across. When docked, the ships were side-by-side on both sides of the river. We had to walk across other ships to get on and off our ship. Getting "parked" in our spot was pretty amazing to watch.

That evening, the ship set sail for Bratislava, Slovakia around sunset passing beautiful scenery along the way. The food on the ship was outstanding, entertainment onboard was fun, and daily excursions gave us a taste of each port. The ship's cruise director, Igor, and his crew absolutely made the cruise! They were from many different countries and were a



delightful addition to the trip.

We arrived in Bratislava, the capital of Slovakia early in the morning. Each day there was an included tour or activity and others that could be added on for a fee. We chose the "active" tour in the morning which was a walk to Bratislava castle and included 300 stairs. We also took a walking tour of the city center. Bratislava is a beautiful city with ornate architecture and cobblestone streets. This afternoon we went back to the city center to check out the shops.

The next port was Vienna, Austria. We joined a city tour in the morning and spent the afternoon exploring the city center. The beautiful churches and other buildings were amazing! We walked up the over 300 steps in the (continued on pg. 4)

spire of St. Stephen's Cathedral to look out over Vienna. Wow! That night we went to a private symphony concert held in a beautiful museum. It was wonderful!

We spent the first part of the next morning in Dürnstein, Austria, probably my favorite port. I can only describe it as a fairytale village. It could have been the model for illustrations in a storybook. The cobblestone streets wound around and around. Just above the town was a castle ruin. We made it about halfway up and unfortunately ran out of time. Next, we loaded up and sailed through the Wachau Valley for about three hours. This stretch of the Danube was the most picturesque of the journey. There were castles, beautiful villages, and churches all along the coast. That afternoon we arrived in Melk, Austria and took a tour of the city and the Melk Abbey. That evening we toured the Melk Castle.

The Linz, Austria port included a full-day tour to Český Krumlov in the Czech Republic. There was another castle to see, winding cobblestone streets, and so many elaborate churches! The river curves around like a horseshoe. We ate locally at an outdoor cafe. Delicious! Our last full day was spent in Passau, Germany touring a local organic farm with sheep, a cow, and large greenhouses. The 40 hectare farm is owned and run by a family of three generations of women. Their family has owned the farm for over 100 years. Later we wandered around Passau. Since it was Sunday, most shops weren't open, but there was plenty to see. The cafes were booming! We listened to a band playing in the square. Beautiful churches, cobblestone streets, and lovely architecture were again the order of the day. The castle hike that we planned to do sounded good, but when it came time, we decided we'd seen enough castles this
