Follow Along to Learn About HOW BILLS ARE MADE



When you look at a bill, do you ever think about how they are made? Or, who designs the bills? We are going to teach you today!

Bills are designed at the Bureau of Engraving and Printing, a part of the U.S. Treasury. The Bureau of Engraving and Printing oversees designing and printing the bills we use every day.

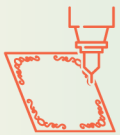
DID YOU KNOW?

ON THEIR OWN!

HOW ARE BILLS MADE?



1 An artist draws what he or she wants the bill to look like.



2 Then, they create an engraving. Artists that do this are called **Engravers**. They use special tools to carve drawings into metal plates.



3 These metal plates are then coated with ink and pressed onto paper to produce **prints**. The precision required in this art form is immense, as even the smallest error can alter the final image.



4 After the bills are printed in large sheets, they are then cut into individual bills and closely inspected to make sure they are perfect.



5 If they pass inspection, they are headed out the door!

BILL CHARACTERISTICS

Each bill has a different characteristic. Here's what to look for.

SYMBOLS

America has a lot of symbols from history built into the artwork on each bill. For example, you will see stars and stripes from the American Flag, Bald Eagles, and the Statue of Liberty.



PICTURES

Every bill has a drawing of a *statesman from history on the front.



TEXTURE

Bills are not made of regular paper. They feel rough and are thicker than normal paper. Bills are made of cotton and linen; this makes them much more durable and lets them last a long time.



DESIGN

The artwork on each bill is quite fancy. When you look at the shapes of the numbers and the designs around the edges, you will notice that they are detailed and very beautiful. Artists work very hard to make every bill look like a unique piece of art.



COLOR

Color is used in different ways on bills. The number and symbols are different colors. For example, there is a purple 5 on the \$5 bill and there are blue stars and red stripes on the \$50 bill. Some bills have color-changing ink on them!

*A **Statesman** is a well-known person whose work has shaped the direction of our country.



WHO'S ON EACH BILL?

There is a different statesman on each bill. Take a look below to see who's on each bill.

\$1

ONE DOLLAR BILL

The \$1 bill has the United States' first President on it, George Washington.



TWO DOLLAR BILL

The \$2 bill has Thomas Jefferson, our 3rd President on it. He wrote the Declaration of Independence, that is why there is a painting of the Declaration of Independence on the back!

FIVE DOLLAR BILL

The \$5 bill has Abraham Lincoln on the front and a photo of Lincoln's Memorial, in Washington D.C. on the back.

TEN DOLLAR BILL

The \$10 bill has Alexander Hamilton on the front. He was the first person to run the U.S. Treasury. This is why there is a picture of the U.S. Treasury building on the back!

TWENTY DOLLAR BILL

The \$20 bill has a picture of Andrew Jackson, America's 7th president on the front, with a photo of the white house on the back.

FIFTY DOLLAR BILL

The \$50 bill shows Ulysses S. Grant, America's 18th President on the front, with a drawing of the U.S. Capitol building on the back.



ONE HUNDRED DOLLAR BILL

The \$100 bill has a picture of Benjamin Franklin. He is famous for printing some of America's very first bills. On the back, you'll see a picture of Independence Hall, in Philadelphia, Pennsylvania.
